

Psalm 16:9–10

9 Therefore my heart is glad and my glory rejoices;
My flesh also will dwell securely.

10 For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol; Nor
will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay.

Luke 24:1–9

1 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they
came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had
prepared.

2 And they found the stone rolled away from the
tomb,

3 but when they entered, they did not find the body of
the Lord Jesus.

4 While they were perplexed about this, behold, two
men suddenly stood near them in dazzling clothing;

5 and as the women were terrified and bowed their
faces to the ground, the men said to them, “Why do
you seek the living One among the dead?”

6 “He is not here, but He has risen. Remember how
He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee,

7 saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into
the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the
third day rise again.”

8 And they remembered His words,

9 and returned from the tomb and reported all these
things to the eleven and to all the rest.

Romans 1:1–4

1 Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an
apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,

2 which He promised beforehand through His
prophets in the holy Scriptures,

3 concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant
of David according to the flesh,

4 who was declared the Son of God with power by
the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit
of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord,

Romans 4:24–25 (NIV)

24 but also for us, to whom God will credit
righteousness—for us who believe in him who raised
Jesus our Lord from the dead.

25 He was delivered over to death for our sins and
was raised to life for our justification.

Romans 10:9–10

9 that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord,
and believe in your heart that God raised Him from
the dead, you will be saved;

10 for with the heart a person believes, resulting in
righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses,
resulting in salvation.

The Glorious Certainties of The Empty Tomb

The resurrection of Jesus is the major event in
redemptive history. It is because of this miracle, that
the essential creeds of our faith are substantiated. This
heartbeat of Christianity confirms with certitude that the
genuine believer’s trust in Jesus to save their soul from
sins eternal condemnation is well placed.

Practical Implications

1. God the Father ordained the death of Jesus and God the Son embraced it as the sole means for providing a satisfying payment for sins debt (Acts 2:22-24). God the Father also ordained the resurrection of our Lord and declared that all who believe that God raised Him from the dead will be saved (Romans 10:9-10).
2. The proper response to this foundational truth of the Christian faith is to repent of your sins and turn in faith to the saving work of Jesus Christ as your only hope of full and final deliverance from sin, and it's eternal condemnation (Mark 1:14-15; Luke 24:46-47; Acts 10:43).
3. The genuine believer should find assurance of their position in Christ, a certainty that their faith in Him is not misguided and an expectant confidence that Jesus will come again, just as He said (Acts 1:9-11; Revelation 1:7).
4. The apostle John stated that our hope and certain expectation of Christ's return, should serve as a prompter for holy living.

1 John 3:2-3 (NASB95)
2 Beloved, now we are children of God, and it has not appeared as yet what we will be. We know that when
He appears, we will be like Him, because we will see Him just as He is.
3 And everyone who has this hope fixed on Him purifies himself, just as He is pure.
