Introductory Illustration

- There used to be a ride at 6Flags called: "The Tidal Wave" —
- you get on this boat and you go down this big hill and when you get to the bottom a tidal wave of water shoots up & just absolutely drenches everyone standing nearby.
 - well, you & I are standing in the very CORE/centerpoint, one of the most gospel-laden paragraphs in the Bible.
 - let's get DRENCHED & IMMERSED & FILLED with the beauty of the GOSPEL.
- It's good news: The Gospel is GOOD NEWS:
 - ❖Good news about GOD
 - **❖**Good news for SINNERS
 - ❖Good news concerning CHRIST
 - ❖Good news extolling the SPIRIT
 - ❖Good news igniting HOPE
 - ❖Good news demanding PROCLAMATION
- The biblical gospel is aptly summed up in v.5-He. Saved. Us.

Background to Titus 3

- Titus 1.5 'set things in order'//church ministry/life
- Ch.1 church leadership; Chs 2-3 Christian living.
- Ch3 how to live in society? (1) vv.1-2 live godly lives; (2) v.3 your depraved past; (3) v.4-7 God's grace in salvation/motivation/enablement for holy living!
 - Godly conduct flows OUT OF God's calling/salvation!

THESIS — This text provides us with the good news of the Christian gospel. 3 toweringly triumphant Truths.

Big point: God saved you *apart from* your own good works.

- 1. Your salvation is exclusively from God.
- 2. Your salvation is emphatically without works.
- 3. Your salvation is *entirely by mercy*.

I. YOUR SALVATION IS EXCLUSIVELY FROM GOD! (5a)

- A. the very word "save" means you're in danger.
- **B.** I'll never forget as a young man being on a church-youth retreat to Panama City Beach when a young girl in our group was swept away with the powerful undertow; She would scream: Help! Help! Help! And, by God's grace, someone did swim out and save her, rescue her, deliver her, save her life. >> that's a picture of the predicament WE were in.
- C. Redeemer HE

1. this God — in Titus 3.4 - the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared... (kind & loving God savior!)

D. Rescue - SAVED

- 1. The context here speaks of God's saving rescue in two-sides: (1) salvation is *accomplished* at Calvary when His kindness & love completed the work of paying for our sin; and (2) salvation is *applied* at regeneration when the Spirit applies Christ's saving work to us *at the moment of conversion*. What a rescue! What a salvation!
- 2. Rescue
- 3. Perfect
- 4. Accomplished
- 5. Sufficient
- 6. Exclusive

E. Recipients - US

- 1. Whom does God save? Whom did Christ die for? Whom does the Spirit regenerate? All those whom the Father elected, the Son bore their wrath & the Spirit gives life. All who are justified by faith, regenerated.
 - *Are YOU in this "US"? Have you crawled your way into this Shelter? Have you RUN to this mighty fortress from the coming storm? Is this *you*?
- Now, at this point: there are two prepositional phrases//clauses that further define *how* God saved us: (1) a strong negation of any contribution on our part; and (2) an emphatic affirmation that salvation is solely based on God's mercy.

II. YOUR SALVATION IS EMPHATICALLY WITHOUT WORKS (5b)

- A. Human impossibilities: jump to the top of the arch in your own strength; climb to the moon on a rope of sand; hold the world & all that's in it in the palm of your hand; count all the stars in the innumerable galaxies (and remember each name!). These are sheer impossibilities for me & you. SO it is impossible for you to save yourself by your own effort, works, accomplishments, achievements, and merits. You cannot do it.
- **B.** NOT on the basis of deeds Howard Marshall writes: "the intention is to rule out DECISIVELY the thought that people can be saved on the basis of (out of) any kind of human works. (Rom 3.20, 28; 4.6; 9.12; Gal 2.16; Eph 2.8-9)
- C. which WE have done *emphatic* ἃ ἐποιήσαμεν ἡμεῖς -- which we ourselves, we have done! (not *our* works). Emphatic. Unmistakable. Prominent.
 - 1. you can't contribute
 - 2. you can't cooperate
 - 3. you can't convert
 - **4.** you can't **confide** in your own efforts
 - 5. you can't comfort your conscience
- **D.** in righteousness οὐκ ἐξ ἔργων τῶν ἐν δικαιοσύνη
 - 1. note the genitive of source/producer: ἐξ ἔργων OUT OF WORKS which *in righteousness*. Just like Israel could not say: "because of my righteousness the Lord has given us this land (Deut 7.7), SO ALSO b/c of our own righteousness we could not attain the heavenly Canaan"
 - 2. none righteous; not even one (Rom 3.10) -- Phil 3.9!!

- E. Note how clear this is in 2 Tim 1.9 --
 - **1.**the perfect salvation (God saved us)
 - **2.**the perfect exclusion (not by our works)
 - **3.** the perfect grace (by his purpose and grace)
- F.Here's the problem! To become a Christian, you must not only renounce & repent of your bad works & your sins, but listen, you must also renounce & repent of your *good* works & your religious merits. Many are willing to repent of their evil deeds; but many are kept out of heaven b/c they don't repent of their good works done in righteousness. Have you come to this? Have you repented of your rebellious deeds AND your righteous deeds??!!

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✓God's Standard — Perfection (can't do it!)
✓God's Commandments — Revelatory (it reveals our sin)
✓God's Justice — Exact, Inflexible (we are sinful & guilty & doomed)
✓God's Provision — Righteousness (God sent Christ: obeyed the Law & suffered for us)
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III. YOUR SALVATION IS ENTIRELY BY MERCY! (5c)

- **A.** So you cannot save yourself--*in the slightest*. In contrast to all your *own human contribution*, please note Paul's *stark contrast*.
- **B. BUT** - $\dot{\alpha}\lambda\lambda\dot{\alpha}$ strong contrast; what people say is important but you gotta pay attention to every word after the *But* -- because that may change everything (I really like you & I think you're a real nice guy, *BUT*...). Well, in this case, the word *does* change everything!
- C. according to his **mercy**; ἕλεος- ready to help those in trouble; ready to deliver those in desperate condition/predicament.
 - **1. Mercy is--** kindness toward the afflicted; it is HELP for the miserable; it is good will toward those in pitiable conditions.
 - 2. I'm reminded of HOSEA. At the end of the book, after recounting 13 chaps of sin, iniquity & depravity & godlessness (in wayward Gomer & wayward Israel), God says they are full of iniquity and in a deplorable, helpless state -- like an orphan (helpless and in desperate need). Hosea 14.4 but in GOD the orphan finds mercy. God will heal them, love them, and turn away his anger. This is God's pity toward those in misery.
- **D.** MEASURE according to
 - 1. MERCY divine pity toward those in deplorable state. mercy is God's pity toward those in misery.
 - **2.** Ezek 39.25 In the future, God will have **mercy** on the House of Israel & be jealous for His holy name(Glory)
 - 3. Matt 9.27 the 2 blind men cry out: "LORD have mercy"
 - **4.** Luke 16.24 the rich man in hell wants **MERCY** b/c he's in agony in the flame
 - **5.** Rom 9.16 it is GOD who has **mercy** (not dependent on the man who works/runs)
 - **6.** 1 Pet 1.3 by God's great **mercy** he caused us to be born again
 - 7. Eph 2.4-5 God being rich in **mercy** b/c of his great love, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together w/ Christ
 - **8.** Rom 15.9 we must glorify GOD for his mercy our response!

CONCL-

Concluding Illustration

- Long ago there was a man -- he was a godly man who was in *deep trouble*. Pain was great. Sin was enormous. Afflictions were pressing. Hardships were acute. Situations were desperate.
 - He stands before God -- knowing this: if God kept a record, *if he marked*, if he tallied up all the sins: **who could stand in righteousness before this Righteous God?**
 - Answer -- NO ONE! NOT EVEN ONE.
- But > (this is mercy!) that afflicted sufferer knows: there is forgiveness with this Judge! He forgives! He delivers! He has mercy! He rescues! We hope in Him. For with this Judge there is *lovingkindness* & abundant redemption! (Psalm 130)
