#### **INTRO-**

Introductory Illustration

- o *Imagine* that you were living in the medieval period (5-15<sup>th</sup> centuries). Say that someone handed you an old *Hebrew Scroll of the Book of PSALMS*.
  - O You began to unroll it, carefully & slowly.
  - You go to the beginning of it & you find Psalm 1 in RED letters & with NO evidence of any number at all.
  - o In some of the great collections of Hebrew MSS that we have, Ps 1 is left unnumbered as a *preface* to the rest of the Psalter & in red letters.
- o It kind of sets the stage for the rest.

THESIS—There is a path that loves God & a path that hates God. A path that delights in God & a path that dishonors God. There is a path that glorifies God & a path that rebels against God. A path that leads to life & a path that leads to death. A path that leads to heaven & a path that leads to hell.

Charles Spurgeon said of this Psalm: "Walk with God, and you cannot mistake the road; you have infallible wisdom to direct you, permanent love to comfort you, and eternal power to defend you" (quoted in Lawson, 13).

#### Find Happiness by Walking on the Godly Path!

This is a **wisdom psalm** that draws from the OT wisdom tradition (Prov 1-9) & the One who is WISDOM incarnate (Jesus – Col 2:3); and the wisdom tradition of the NT (James 3.13-18). **Do you want to be wise? Skillfull? Equipped for Godly & right & happy living?** 

**Proverbs 13:13** The one who despises the word will himself be ruined, But the one who fears the commandment will be rewarded.

# I. SEE THE PATH OF THE GODLY MAN (1-3)

The happy man delighting in God!

There is a road that leads to abundant happiness & joy. It's not the road that most travel on nor is it the road that we *might naturally* choose.

# 3 qualifying phrases:

- a. His satisfaction in the Lord! (1a)
  - i. אַשְׁבֵי־הָאִיש how *blessedness<u>es</u>* (plural!) how abundant, many, fulfilling are the *joys/happinesses*. **Happy the man!**
- b. His separation from the world! (1b)
  - i. Does not walk in the counsel of the wicked
    - 1. \*discernment\* beware ungodly counsel!
  - ii. Does not stand in the path of sinners
  - iii. Does not sit in the seat of scoffers.
    - 1. Note the progression!

- 2. Guard the steps that lead to SIN: (1) considering sin (walking); (2) contemplating sin (standing); and (3) being comfortable in sin (sitting/dwelling).
- 3. Let us flee the first step. The rolling stone descends with quickening speed.

**NOTE:** you can't only *refrain* from being separated from the wicked. You need to *replace* that void with something else. **CHANGE!** 

Your testimonies also are my delight and my counselors (Psalm 119:24)

## c. His saturation in the Word! (2)

- i. **BUT** (strong contrast):
- ii. In the LAW (Torah) of Yahweh he delights
- iii. And in the LAW he *meditates* day & night.
  - 1. יֶּהְגֶּה meditate inward digestion to bring outward transformation. *Murmur, whisper, mutter* over & over.
  - 2. Do YOU meditate?
  - 3. Listen to how Jeremiah 15:16 puts it.
- iv. What is YOUR delight?? What makes you truly happy?

**So literally** did a Jewish sect, called the <u>Essenes</u> who lived at Qumran by the Dead Sea, take this phrase "day & night" that they established a rotation of interpreters to study & expound the Law of God 24 hours a day! (Wilson, 103)!!

For the psalmist, the Scriptures are his "soul-refreshing feast."

**Martin Luther said:** "I could not live in paradise without the word of God, but I could live well enough in hell with it."

**OH YES---he's like a tree**. One translation (Tg) has "living tree".

Firmly planted by streams of water (=healthy)

\*note passive participle God did it!

It gives fruit in season (=living, production, fruit)

Its leaf does not wither (=lasting, enduring)

All that he does prospers (=hand of God w/ him)

- --you live w/ hope of God's blessing.
- --cf. Jeremiah 17:7-10 (allusion!)
- --it is the godly man who bears fruit (Gal 5.22-23)

**Psalm 119:1** How blessed are those whose way is blameless, Who walk in the law of the LORD.

The godly man has a constant eye on God, on His Word, & on the path He wants me to go! Is that you? The path You're on?

Luther said: the one who delights in & meditates on the Word of God finds more in the Psalms *in his own study* than all the other interpretations & human advice that others may give (in Kraus, 122).

Are you on the path of the godly man?

# II. FLEE THE PATH OF THE WICKED MAN (4-5)

The evil man destroyed by God

רארבֵן הְרְשָׁעֵים - *strong contrast*; stark contrast! Ancient translations double the negative: "*Not so* the wicked...*Not So!* (2x!—LXX)

### a. The wicked man is corrupted (4)

- i. γα΄ chaff. *In the ANE*, chaff is the light 'shell' around the kernel of grain. In your field you'd take wheat & go to the hill & throw it up in the air so the wind would drive the worthless *chaff away* but the precious WHEAT would fall to the ground for harvesting.
- ii. Chaff is worthless, useless, thrown away & burnt. Light, hollow.
- iii. The wind drives the chaff away (blows it, pushes it); LXX: "throws it away".
  - 1. <u>note</u> how *short & terse* this verse is.
    - 2. How weak & worthless they are. *They will have NO* shield in the day of battle. *They have NO light* when darkness dwarfs them; *they have NO eternal arm* to lean upon; *they have no compassionate heart* to beat for them; *they'll have NO loving eye* to watch over them!
    - 3. <u>THEY</u> will blow away like the lightest, most hollow little wrapper in the tornado of God's Judgment! **Quick lived & forever dying.**
  - iv. *Remember John the Baptist?* Matthew 3:12 "His winnowing fork is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clear His threshing floor; and He will gather His wheat into the barn, but He will burn up the **chaff with unquenchable fire**."

Here's the amazing & startling truth. *Note how close the wheat & the chaff grow together*. The wheat is Godly. The chaff grows up with it but is worthless, blown away & destroyed.

#### b. The wicked man is condemned (5)

i. <u>THEREFORE</u>--The wicked will not stand:

## 1. in the Judgment

- **a.** B/c the wicked are so light & worthless & easily blown away, they are found *wanting/lacking*.
- b. They have 'no escape' no 'mask to wear' no 'rock to hide in' and no 'boat to deliver to safety'.
- 2. in the assembly of the righteous.
  - a. Presently the wicked have no place in the assembly of the righteous.
    - i. Sooner would a fish live upon a tree than a wicked man in the eternal heaven (Spurgeon, 1/1:3)

- **b.** In the future the wicked will have no portion in the eternal assembly of saints (Rev 21:8; 22:15)!
- **3.** *Ultimately* In the great white throne (Rev 20.11-15) they will have nowhere to stand or go or flee to!
- ii. Nahum 1:2-6 (who can stand?); & Rev 6:17 (who can stand in the day of God's wrath?)
  - 1. What a sobering & saddening & sickening scene. They cannot stand; they are corrupt & condemned!

# But Christ stood CONDEMNED **in our place** before the judgment bar of God & satisfied justice.

And BTW- Jesus fulfilled v.1 – perfectly!!
"For" or "because" – here's the reason/result of what's been said.

#### **CONCLUSION: (v.6) TWO DESTINIES (judgment)**

- o יוֹדֵע יֵהוַה- The *LORD* knows (intimate knowledge)
  - o God knows the way of the righteous
    - Interesting that in the book of Acts, *Christianity is called "THE WAY"*—the godly man walks *in the way of the godly*. Are YOU?
  - o But the LORD is absent from the wicked
  - o Brings it back full circle (inclusio w/ v.1 way of the wicked).
    - The way of the wicked תאבד-A—Z psalm.
    - The psalm begins with <u>happy blessings</u> and it ends with <u>torturous perishing</u>. These are the 2 choices. Which are you on?
- o This is not the only occurrence of TWO ways in life
  - o Deut 30:15-20
  - o Matt 7:13-15

**Isaiah 55:7** <sup>7</sup> Let the **wicked** forsake **his way** And the unrighteous man his thoughts; And let him return to the LORD, And He will have compassion on him, And to our God, For He will abundantly pardon.

#### PRAYING PSALM 1

- Lord, keep me in the path of the godly and the righteous instead of the path of sinners (v. 1)
- Make Your Word my delight by day and by night (v. 2)
- Father, establish me and ground me in You and Your Word (v. 3).
- O God, bring the unrighteous to justice in Your time and Your way (vv. 4- 5).
- Thank You, Lord, for knowing about me, understanding my life, and caring for me (v. 6).
