Introductory Illustration

The **grand subject** of this psalm is the **exhortation** to <u>Give Thanks to the LORD</u> for his goodness & mercy which are perpetual & endure forever (Pierce, 519).

So important is this it's repeated 26x. None like it.

How worthy our God is of our...

- continued devotion
- constant attention
- captivating affection
- confident expectation
- Christ-centered recollection
- celestial adoration

No less than 26x we're told God's love is everlasting!

Background to Psalm 136

- **Anonymous**; but the theme is remembering *God's goodness & covenant-love*.
 - If there's anything emphatic here, it's the repeated, key, identical phrase: FOR HIS LOVE IS FOREVER!!!
 - Thomas Watson says: "God never repents of His electing love"
- This song recites the constant phrase & expounds the covenant-love of God!
- "This love of God toward his saints is higher, deeper, wider, and longer than anyone can comprehend. Throughout all the ages to come, God's covenant-love for His people, like a mighty river, will be flowing as strong in eternity future as when it first began in eternity past (Lawson, 320).
 - You can experience it now! You can swim in God's love now! And for endless eternities to come you can adore His saving love!

Key phrase: for his lovingkindness is everlasting [NASB] -- 26x

His steadfast love endures forever (ESV/NIV)

His mercy endureth forever (KJV)

His loyal love endures (NET)

- ► CAUSE = for...
- **COVENANT-LOVE** = his lovingkindness...
- **▶CONSTANCE** = is...
- **▶CONTINUANCE** = everlasting...
 - The same covenant-love that God has for His son He displayed toward His people Israel & he has shown toward us as His NT people, the church (one body of Jew/Gentile).
 - ▶This covenant-love cannot...
 - ▶ fade away
 - ▶rust away
 - ▶ drift away
 - ▶ change away

▶tire away (cf. Rom 8.35ff)

THESIS — heap up reasons for us to thank God & see His eternal, covenant-love displayed... **LET US THANK GOD FOR HIS...**

- 1. Character (1-3)
- 2. Creation (4-9)
- 3. Conquests (10-22)
- 4. Compassion (23-26)

I. CHARACTER (1-3)

The main object/action/actor of this psalm: "LORD (v.1), God of gods (v.2), Lord of lords (v.3)

Every other verse is 'he' or 'who...' or 'to him...'

It's all about GOD's character, God's conduct, God's compassion

It's about God's attributes, God's accessibility

A. Self-existing covenant-keeper (1)

- 1. Give thanks [הוֹדוּן] the hebrew verb means to confess/acknowledge = we should give THOUGHTFUL, grateful worship!
- 2. To this Yahweh because he's good [בִּי־טוֹב]
- B. Supreme God (2)
- C. Sovereign Lord (3)

This always is the bedrock foundation: God's character!

II. $\underline{\text{CREATION}}$ (4-9)

- A. V.4 WONDERS /wonderful acts = v.5-9 spells it out
- **B.** V.5-9 follows the Genesis 1 account
 - 1. v.5 Gen 1.1
 - 2. v.6 Gen 1.2
 - 3. v.7 Gen 1.14-18
 - 4. v.8 Gen 1.16
 - 5. v.9 Gen 1.16
 - > the historicity of Genesis
 - > the reality of Genesis
 - > the miracle of Genesis
 - > the understandability of Genesis
 - > the importance of Genesis
 - > the God of Genesis!
 - a) let us not forget that this birthing of creation (Gen 1) is a picture of the new-birth that God gives to us (John 3)
 - **b)**the God creating LIGHT in darkness (Gen 1) is a picture of God speaking spiritual light in dark hearts (2 Cor 4)

What a God who creates! Who forms! Who speaks!!

III. CONQUESTS! (10-22)

These verses put the spotlight on God's deliverance & guidance & protection of His people! Egypt, Wilderness, Conquest, Canaan (Ex-Josh)

A. Egypt (10-15)

- 1. GOD's work in Egypt -- and his providing for His people ISRAEL>>>
- **2.** v.10 Ex 12.29

Not just history -- but reminder that God judges ALL enemies. God struck firstborn b/c they didn't hear & heed the prophet's Word -- they had NO blood of the sacrificial Lamb covering them (so, as a result, the angel of Death passed over & destroyed them)!

- 3. v.11 Ex 12.51
- **4.** v.12 Ex 13.9
 - **a)** Spurgeon: "God made a road across the sea-bottom causing the divided waters to stand like walls on other side" (Spurgeon, 208).
- **5.** v.13 Ex 14.21
- 6. v.14 Ex 14.22
- 7. v.15 Ex 14.27
 - > the historicity of the Exodus
 - > the miracle of the Exodus
 - > the importance of the Exodus
 - > the gospel of the Exodus

B. Wilderness (16-22)

1. WILDERNESS WANDERINGS/God's deliverance of His people

- **2.** v.16 Ex 13.18; 15.22
 - a) God goes [לְמוּלִיהְ] with his people. Walks/goes.
- **3.** v.17 Ps 135.10-12
 - a) Struck down great kings = God's power!
- 4. v.18 Deut 29.7
- **5.** v.19 Num 21.21-24
- **6.** v.20 Num 21.33-35
- 7. v.21 Josh 12.1
- **8.** v.22 Ps 105.6
 - a) What a God who gives *us* an eternal inheritance in Christ (Col 3.24 the reward of our inheritance; 1 Pet 1.4 an inheritance undefiled reserved in heaven for us)!
 - **b)**Remember: God led them into it & therefore he pledged himself to guide them/lead them though it!

• **POLEMICAL ARGUMENTS**

- see how Psalm 136 totally obliterates evolution & all evolutionary-like theories.
 - Creation is wholly & absolutely by divine fiat/command (divine, spoken Word)
- see how Psalm 136 totally smashes a small/puny/wimpy god of today's pop-culture
 - The Bible reveals God as powerful, sovereign, victorious, triumphant & holy.

IV. COMPASSION! (23-26)

- **A.** V.23 praise God He remembered us in our *lowly* estate!
 - 1. What a condescending, compassionate, humbling God!
- **B.** V.24 he redeemed us/rescued us.
- C. V.25 God provides!
- **D.** V.26 ends where began: *call to all to thank!*

I suppose we could add a 5th "C" to our outline:

V. <u>CHRIST</u> (24)

A. v.24 - God delivered us -- ויפרקנו in Hebrew; lutrow in LXX

1. This is the eminent/ultimate/climactic reason for giving thanks!

B. REDEEMED US...

C. Ultimately, we as NT believers CAN & MUST give thanks to God for

HE has redeemed us from our adversaries = for his love endures forever

- 1. The monergistic nature of redemption (God alone did it)
- 2. The desperate need for redemption (redeemed us from slavery)
- 3. The particular elect who receive the redemption ('us')
- 4. The absolute power of redemption (from...; away from; liberated; set free from bondage)
- 5. The overwhelming tyrants to be redeemed from (our adversaries...)
- 6. The sovereign love in redemption (his love...)
- 7. The everlasting duration of redemption (endures forever...)

Sin is our enemy & we are redeemed from it by the atoning blood of Christ!

- 1. **communion** (1 Cor 11)
- 2. thankful prayer (1 Thess 5.17)
- 3. exhortations to one another (Col 1 & Col 3)
- 4. preaching the Word
- 5. **gospel of grace** (Rom 8.28-30)
